

Clearly skies reveal God’s glory, plainly showing what he has done. Every day his handiwork proclaimed, every night proclaims his truth. Speech nor word, no sound is heard still creation knows. Clearly skies reveal God’s glory, plainly showing what he has done. Winter death just beauty sleep, life renewed in spring. Wake, awake my soul and sing for he has done marvelous things. He created children from dust; he created children of hope. Clearly God revealed in creation, plainly showing what he has done.

This is part of a song I wrote many years ago. The words are portions of a song that I wanted to share along with my thoughts this month. *“This is the day the LORD has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it.”*
Psalm 118:24.

What is one of the first things you do in the morning? I look outside to see if it is sunny or cloudy. When Pastor Mark or I make coffee we open the screen door to feel the temperature. We look out to see the yard, the crop that the farmer has planted on our land and the row of “gnarly” trees growing on the creek bed. At this time of year, we may be lucky to watch a mother deer with her babies walking along the creek bed. We have some wild grass that we know deer have used as a bed. How do I know that? Pastor Mark was mowing when a deer was spooked and got up and ran towards the woods.

Why are we so intrigued with creation? Because God created it for us. It is one of his gifts for us to enjoy. In the beauty of his creation I cannot begin to imagine the beauty of creation before sin. The psalmist writes of the glory of God’s creation and then he asks the question. **Psalm 8:3-4** *“When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?”*

When humanity fell, so did creation. One of the punishments God told Adam was that he would have to till the soil and pull weeds. **Romans 8:19-22** references creation being subjected to futility. Yet there is hope that creation will be set free from its bondage. There will be that day of hope when true believers and creation are finally restored as God intended.

“Sing to the Lord of harvest; sing songs of love and praise; with joyful hearts and voices, your alleluias raise. By him the rolling seasons in fruitful order move; sing to the Lord of harvest a joyous song of love. God makes the clouds drop fatness, the deserts bloom and spring, the hills leap up in gladness, the valleys laugh and sing. 



Young Lady Finds Shelter at Hope City

They spent time sharing with her about the freedom available through Christ, took her shopping for new clothes, and then to Hope City. One of our faithful staff members, Nicole, stayed up past 2am checking her in and getting her a bed. The young lady decided not to stay so please pray for her and for Stephanie as she continues rescuing ladies from human trafficking.
