The "I AM" is With You!!!

"Later that night, the boat was in the middle of the lake, and he was alone on land. He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. Shortly before dawn he went out to them, walking on the lake. He was about to pass by them, but when they saw him walking on the lake, they thought he was a ghost. They cried out, because they all saw him and were terrified. Immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." Then he climbed into the boat with them, and the wind died down. They were completely amazed..." (Mark 6:47-51) See also Matthew 14:24-33 and John 6:16-21

Immediately (Jesus) spoke with them and said, "Have courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." (Mark 6:50b)

In 1979, I was stationed on the USS Haleakala – AE25. Our ship was attached to a carrier group in the Pacific. You might remember that in November of that year there was a takeover of the U.S. embassy in Iran followed by hostages being taken which went on for 444 days. Because of that action our group spent considerable time in and around the Indian Ocean, and we spent a good deal of time in the Philippines docked for replenishment. In February or March of 1980, we were alerted that we would be leaving Subic Bay as a typhoon was approaching the islands there. Apparently the whole fleet was leaving as it was safer to be at sea than moored at the pier during this hurricane storm.

Well, our ship steamed for 3 days through the storm and what a wild ride it was. Waves at times were 75-100 feet high. How do I know you ask? Well, even though no one was to be on deck, some of us would stand aft (that is on the back side for you land lovers) of the super structure, which was five stories high. As the ship would dive through waves the water would come crashing over the ship. We were protected by the wall against which we were standing. Sometimes the ship would dip into a trough between two waves, whose height rose as tall as the ship's mast!

As brave a face as many of us put on, there was a good deal of fear in the air. Not much sleep was had, as people were being tossed out of their bunks because the ship would roll so violently. The galley served a lot of sandwiches as the turbulence made it impossible for them to cook on their stoves. I am sure that God heard a lot of praying during those three days, at least from me. I do not know about my ship mates but you could cut the tension in the air with a knife.

All three passages I mentioned involve storms—probably much greater and more horrifying than my naval experience. After all I was on a 400 foot ship. But all three instances induced fear in the hearts of those involved. So often we refer to the trials of our lives as "storms." Likewise, our trials often have the same effect on us that these storms had on the disciples, and me. We're afraid—even paralyzed—at times.

Yet there is a great theme of comfort in each of these passages and some great truths to which we can cling: ***Don't be surprised to find Christ right there with you in your storm.*** In every passage, it seemed that Jesus was the last person the disciples expected to see during their crisis. Psalm 23:4 says: "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for You are with me." It doesn't say, "You are waiting for me once the clouds have parted," but instead "WITH me." Jesus is with you in every storm. The common theme of these passages isn't the storm, but the fact that Jesus was faithful to rescue every time. There's no need to be paralyzed by your storm. Once Peter recognized Christ (Matthew 14:28-29), he gained enough courage to step out of the boat and right into the storm. We so often focus on the fact that Peter almost drowned in the next verse instead of following his lead to live out your faith—EVEN in your storm, for there is no greater source of comfort than Jesus.

Take a look at our key verse one more time. When Jesus said, "It is I," the "I" literally translates "I AM." The One asking us to not be afraid is the One who laid the foundations of earth, who has no beginning or end, who's faithful to His every word. Every storm has the ability to draw you closer to Christ and make you stronger in your faith. In the Matthew passage, the disciples drew this conclusion from their storm experience with Jesus: "You are certainly God's Son!" (Matthew 14:33b). They knew the Savior of the world had rescued them. In the midst of difficulties, rest in the fact that Jesus is with you—every time. Cling to His Word, pray, and spend every possible moment in fellowship with Him. You don't have to be afraid. You can have courage.

The "I AM" is with you!

COUNCIL MINUTES

Ascension Lutheran Church of Navarino
Council Minutes
July 20, 2014

Present: Darrel Klemp, Dennis Fuerst, Al Meiers, Lisa Wollenberg, Pastor Jon Paquette, Dave Rohrer.
Absent: John Wudtke Guests: Ralph & Jean Miller, Owen & Sue Poole.

Meeting was called to Order by President Darrel at 8:04 AM. Pastor Jon led a short devotional entitled “Wheat in the Weeds”.

Minutes from June 15, 2014 had been emailed to each of the Council members earlier, and were accepted as published.

Pastor Report – Given and accepted as presented.

Treasurer’s / Finance Report - Dennis presented the report covering the first half of the fiscal year. With appropriate adjustments, the first half is relatively on budget. It was also discussed, and decided, that our benevolent giving would not be adjusted until year end. Motion by Rohrer, second by Meiers, and Approved.

Committee Reports – Darrel reported the Property Committee has signed a new LP contract at a \$1.54 per gallon for the next 9 month season. They had checked with 4 local vendors and this was the cheapest of the four.

Old Business:

Kitchen Project – Dave reported that it is completed, AND UNDER BUDGET. Council wishes to thank ALL those who helped in any capacity.

Community Dinners – Pastor Jon reported that all is going quite well, and attendance is slowly growing. Come join us, it’s open to everyone. They are held the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 5:30 PM. Come and enjoy yourself.

NALC Update – Lots happening on the Synod side of things. Pickup a flyer in the narthex of the Church, or go to the website for details.

Storage Building – This project is currently dormant. Shawano High School students are building the 4’ x 8’ panels, and school is out until Labor Day.

Volunteer Mowing at the Church – Pastor reported that currently the work list has been prepared and seems to be working. However, there is always room for more, so if you have a couple of hours every other month or so, you may want to help out. Many hands make light work. And it’s a way of contributing back to YOUR church.

VISITOR/Website Committee – Darrel reported that that the online version has been well accepted.

Church Insurance – We recently moved our property insurance from Hastings Mutual to Church Mutual. We received a note from the agent saying that he had erred and the operating equipment for the solar panels was not covered under the new policy. Since it was his error, the Company has agreed to cover the equipment until the next renewal at no additional cost. The Council chose to accept that offer for this year.

Food Pantry request for an additional freezer – The Council approved the addition of a freezer, if it could be contained in the two rooms they currently occupy. Our understanding is that the freezer has been ordered.

New Business:

Church Sign – It was brought to the Council’s attention that the glass in the outdoor sign is broken. Further discussion revealed that the wood, and signboard itself, are also in poor condition. A small group will look into some replacement options and costs.

Flag Pole – The Millers & Pooles have suggested the addition of a flagpole on the Church property. They were asked to present thoughts and proposals on erecting such a project. Council took no action.

Next Council Meeting – August 17, 2014 at 8:00 AM.

Adjournment – Motion by Fuerst, second by Meiers, approved at 9:04 AM.


'Which service, the 8:00 or the 10:30?'

Applesauce Banana Bread

Ingredients

4 ripe bananas, 1 cup sugar, 1/2 cup applesauce, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 1 tablespoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 cups flour

Directions

Preheat oven to 350. Place bananas in a large bowl and mash with electric mixer. Stir in sugar and let stand 15 minutes. Add applesauce and eggs and beat well. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Pour into greased 9x5 loaf pan. Bake for 45 minutes, or until wooden toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove from oven and let stand 10 minutes before removing from pan, cool on wire rack. NOTE: Mini muffins 13–15 minutes or mini loaf pan 35–40 minutes.

Food Network 3 Ingredient Pulled Pork

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (2 pound) pork tenderloin (pork shoulder or butt can also be used)
- 1 (12 ounce) can of root beer
- 1 (18 ounce) bottle of barbecue sauce
- 8 hamburger buns

DIRECTIONS

Place the pork tenderloin in a slow cooker and pour the can of root beer over the meat. Cover and cook on low for 6 hours or until pork shreds easily with a fork.

After pork has cooked, drain and discard the root beer. Shred the pork and place it back in the slow cooker. Pour the barbecue sauce over the pork and stir to combine. Serve immediately or keep warm in slow cooker until ready to serve. Serve on hamburger buns.

Note: The root beer acts as a tenderizer and after soaking in it all day, the pork practically melts in your mouth. Not only does the root beer work better than a store bought meat tenderizer, it gives the pork a hint of sweetness. I've used other flavors of soda, but root beer is by far my favorite.
