

Words from your interim pastor

There is terror and despair as we read and watch what is happening in our world. The recent events have caused many to ask; why does God let these things happen? God knows what he is doing. His sovereignty over all things is perfect and true. We are to pray for hearts to be changed. You could say that the world is at war within itself. But Jesus tells us “take courage, I have conquered the world.” (John 16:33).

Jesus teaches us about the futile nature of worrying. In Matthew 6:25-34 you will find that teaching. I want to share the heart of this teaching with you. **Matthew 6:26-30** *Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith?*

Distractions cause us to worry about daily events because we are relying on our limited resources. Worry leads to burdens that zap our strength and we become overwhelmed. This kind of worry paralyzes us into inaction or dangerous actions.

Jesus uses humble examples of his creation to apply to his most cherished love; that’s you and me. Jesus tells us to look around and observe the birds of the air. They are free and have no worries. They were not created to harvest crops to provide their own food, and yet they are feed. A bird cannot do the work of a farmer as we do; yet, it is not free from labor, but it does the work for which it was created, namely, it bears its young, feeds them and sings to our God a song for the privilege of doing this. We have all heard birds singing early in the morning the song it has learned. The bird doesn’t worry about where it will find food. When it is hungry, it flies away and finds a “grain of corn,” where God stored one away for it. This is a powerful example and stirs us to trust God more than we do, even during the events of the world that cause pain. Therefore Jesus asks: *Are not you of much more value than they?”*

Jesus teaches us not to worry about our life. Your life is not yours, nor is your body (Psalm 139: 15-16). He uses another example of the flowers in the field and encourages us not to worry or be anxious. *“The flowers stand there and make us blush and become our teachers. Thank you flowers; you, who are to be devoured by the cows! God has exalted you very highly, that you become our masters and teachers. We must confess that the most insignificant flower, that the cattle tread under foot, should become our teacher.”*

**Martin Luther** Jesus goes on to say that King Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like the flowers; lilies, carnations, roses, and yes, dandelions.

What does the subject of worry have to do with the events we are witnessing now? We are called to do the good works that we are created to do in Christ Jesus to glorify our Father in heaven just as the birds and the flowers do what they are created to do. We will find peace in listening to the voice of our heavenly Father. *“This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!”* In a world that sees despair, God rises up against those who would want to harm us. Do not worry. God’s people are the Apple of His eye. He will protect us from the ultimate carnage that humanity can impose on each other. We were not promised a life without suffering but He promises us Eternal Life where there will be no more pain, death, and crying. There will only be joy in heaven. We receive the peace from God that the world cannot give.



Dear Friends of Ascension:

Greetings in the name of our risen Lord. We would just like to update you on several important matters happening here at Ascension.

As you know Pastor Jon took a call to Trinity, Birchwood, WI last August. Currently a call committee is going through the process of evaluating some pastors who have expressed an interest in coming to Ascension. Just a couple of Sundays ago, one of the potential pastors on our call list preached a sermon here at Ascension. We trust and pray that soon the call process will continue to move forward in God’s time and we will soon have a new shepherd leading the flock here at Ascension. We are thankful for the provision of Pastor Sabin who is leading us in the time of transition.

This past spring Ascension took a leap forward in faith and decided to address the issue of the worn out, damaged carpeting and flooring in the Fellowship Hall and in the Narthex. A committee was formed and its job was to search for possible replacements. Their recommendation came forward at a \$17,500 price tag which was approved by the congregation.

Moving forward the task is to fund the project. Once the money is garnered, Ascension will progress to purchasing and installation of the new flooring. In the meanwhile \$5,000 has been already been gathered for this cause, but much more is needed.

**Here is where you can be of help to our congregation** Have you, some family member or friend celebrated a life’s milestone recently? Perhaps a wedding anniversary, a special birthday, a baptism or birth in the family has occurred? Maybe you or a loved one recovered from surgery, or experienced safe travels on a trip. Have you been the recipient of God’s special goodness lately? The list for reasons to celebrate life’s events are endless. Thanks be to God for his unspeakable gifts!

Many people sometimes consider sending a thank offering to the Lord in response to his goodness. You can do the same! Families can send memorials to Ascension in memory, or in honor of, those special people or important events. The Meeting was called to Order by President Darrel at 8:06 AM. Ralph Mueller led a devotion, and Pastor offered a prayer.

The Minutes from 6-19-16 were reviewed, and upon a Motion by Lisa, second by Glen, were approved as published.


## Silent Prayer Siege

### How We Pray for the Unborn

During a silent siege we pray in silence outside of an abortion clinic standing for the unborn in the womb whose voices cannot be heard. Sometimes we are asked how we keep engaged in prayer while standing in silence week after week.

One main thing that keeps our hearts sustained is focusing on Christ praying for the light instead of praying against the darkness. Our hearts are uplifted when we look on the beautiful God Man Jesus, for without Him we would become too weighed down by all the injustice around us.

Taking time right at the beginning of a silent siege to ask God what is on His heart helps immensely. Praying outside the actual abortion clinic gives us a unique opportunity to see people coming in and out of the building. We not only pray for the babies in the womb, but also for God to transform the hearts of the women, fathers of the children, parents or family members of the woman, doctors, nurses, administrators or office workers, the security workers, and even the people who honk their horns or yell at us as they drive by. We pray for salvation, for a revelation of who God is and what He is like, and also for revelation of the precious life in the womb. We pray for open doors and help for the women who may find themselves in difficult circumstances with seemingly no help or way out.




