

Words from your interim Pastor

Matthew 15:21-28; *Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. 22 Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, 'Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon.'* **23** But he did not answer her at all. *And his disciples came and urged him, saying, 'Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us.'* **24** He answered, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.' **25** *But she came and knelt before him, saying, 'Lord, help me.'* **26** He answered, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' **27** *She said, 'Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.'* **28** Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.' *And her daughter was healed instantly.*

I always find comfort in this exchange of the Gentile woman and Jesus. It showed the witness of a woman's petition to God. She acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah of the Israel. Yet she knew that Jesus was also her Messiah.

Matthew identifies this Gentile woman as a Canaanite. By doing this Matthew identified this woman with the Old Testament enemy of Israel. The encounter between Jesus and the Canaanite woman is on the boundary between the old and the new, between men and women, Jews and Gentiles, between enemy and friend.

The woman identified Jesus as Lord, Son of David. She shouts begging Jesus to have mercy on her daughter. Jesus does not respond to her. His silence is stunning and deafening. Jesus' lack of response to the woman's initial appeal serves to underscore her persistence. This silence on the part of Jesus is actually the mysterious and fearsome silence of God which we read in some of the Psalms. Faith endures in God's silence. It is the same silence Jesus experienced on the cross when he called out to God; "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" God the Father was silent. This is a faith knowing God is trustworthy and faithful in all circumstances.

Jesus refused the woman's request. He said; "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." (vs.24) The woman had obstacles in her petition to Jesus; the silence of Jesus, the annoyed Disciples, and the definition of the mission of the Messiah which is the lost sheep of Israel, and not to this Gentile woman and her daughter.

This woman ignored all of these "road blocks." This Canaanite woman responds to Jesus' Messianic identity with reverence as she knelt down in worship before Jesus. The woman said again to Jesus; "Lord, help me." Jesus broke his silence when he says to her; "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." The term "dog" was how the Jews referred to Gentiles. Even though the language from Jesus is harsh, it actually is his true identity. Jesus is Israel's Messiah and he has been sent to the house of Israel. Jesus can only be the Savior of all people by remaining faithful to God's chosen people even in the midst of their rejection of him. When the Canaanite woman made her second petition for Jesus' help she understood he is the promised Son of David. Jesus' obedience to his Father as Messiah of Israel proclaims him Savior of the world.

The woman does not challenge Jesus definition of himself or his mission. She accepts that Jesus is Israel's Messiah; as the one sent to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. The woman understood that this also included her and her daughter when she petitioned Jesus for the second time; "Yes Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table." (vs.27) The woman is saying that even the Gentiles are fed by Israel's Messiah. Jesus responded to the woman, "Great is your faith. Let it be done for you as you wish." The Canaanite woman's daughter is healed. (vs. 28)

This account shows Jesus is faithful to his calling as Israel's Messiah. It is also an account of the Canaanite woman, whose people were once Old Testament enemies. She was able to discern that Israel's Messiah was her Messiah too. This account is a glimpse of the breaking through of the Kingdom of heaven for all people.

God is always faithful. When you think that our Heavenly Father is silent, he is always present. He hears all prayers, answers all prayers according to his will. Any who comes to believe in Jesus, crucified and raised will be saved.

The first few days we arrived in California we met with and ministered to several people. We were amazed at the connections God allowed us to make with both old and new friends.

We then really enjoyed getting to serve, pray and worship with 65,000 people at TheCall Azusa Now prayer

gathering at the Los Angeles Coliseum. We were encouraged to speak into the lives of so many young adults hungry for God and revival in our nation. Similar to our Onething Conference this past December, one key theme was that God is unifying the church. Multiple denominations and ministries came together under love for Jesus and the Word of God to labor together in the Great Commission. There was a lot of reconciliation and repentance during the prayer gathering. One special moment of this was having representatives from many Native American tribes led us in a time of prayer and worship and called forth the Native people to turn to God. So much happened throughout the day it is difficult to pick only a few highlights. We witnessed many healings during the day. People got out of wheelchairs and walked after being unable for over 20 years, and many who served in the military were healed of injuries and hearing loss from combat.

Hope City Bringing Hope to Inner City KC

Imagine a prayer meeting where drug addicts get set free, the fatherless find a family, and the hungry are fed. Imagine a prayer meeting where anyone is accepted, and people from all walks of life can come to spend time with Jesus and find community. Located in one of Kansas City's toughest neighborhoods, Hope City is involved in rescuing addicts, providing a safe place for rehabilitation, running a walk-in soup kitchen and food distribution project to the neighborhood, providing showers and laundry services for the homeless, and keeping a prayer room 24 hours a day, five days a week.

At Hope City, people who may not be welcomed into your average local church are brought in with open arms and raised up to become powerful intercessors. They are encouraged to use their gifts in our spiritual community where they find a place to belong. Here, the Holy Spirit gives beauty for ashes, joy for mourning, and a garment of praise for a spirit of heaviness every day right before our eyes.

In January, we transitioned to serving in the inner city Hope City under the IHOPKC. Every week, Jonathan leads worship while Theresa serves as a prayer leader. In addition, we find ourselves regularly pastoring young adults. God has opened such amazing doors for us! We are so thankful to be a part of all He is doing.

Dear friends, family and supporters,

Late spring greetings to all of you from a heating up North Texas. You maybe, just now, adjusting to being outside once again after a long and cold winter. However, for Texans we've been mowing the lawn since late February and it will be so until November.

We have some news: Marshall was planning on coming to Wisconsin summer of 2016 with a desire to see you face-to-face. However, the home he normally stays in with his brother Meril and wife Nancy in Neenah, WI was not available or at least unsure at the time Marshall needed to make plans for meetings and speaking engagements. Consequently, Marshall finally decided to postpone the Wisconsin trip until summer of 2017.

This year marks our 41st year of serving missions worldwide through language development with a focus on Bible Translation. Seems only yesterday we left our jobs in Appleton, WI to begin training at the University of Oklahoma. The advances of Bible Translation, since then, have been phenomenal in all levels. Millions around the world are, however, still living far from Christ. And without God's Word in a language they can understand, they don't have the tools needed to start a new life.

Many of the Bibleless people live in fear. Pugong, an Ifugao speaker from the Philippines was one of those living in fear of spirits. For years he struggled with giving up previously held beliefs, however, he heard the Gospel message in Ifugao by listening to recordings in his language.

After all the fear and denial, Pugong one day faced his fear and said, "I'm ready to accept Christ and will be His follower forever." Pugong's son-in-law is now a Christian and a highly respected pastor within the community—God's Word does not come back void, ever.

Vanice and I deeply appreciate your walk with us through your financial support and prayers to provide this precious Word of God to people, like Pugong and others who are still waiting.

Our oldest son Cory has recently moved to San Antonio, Texas accepting a new position as Director of Human Resources for 3R Hyperbaric and Wound Healing Clinics. He has worked very hard to get to this professional level and we are so proud of him.


