

Why is baptism prerequisite for taking communion?

This was a recent question asked during one of our book studies. Recently our Bishop, John Bradowsky wrote on the topic. I will not repeat that here. If you are interested in what he has to say – there are copies of his writing on the table outside the sanctuary.

So, here goes!..... To be clear, not all churches would answer the question in the same way. I believe though, that I am safe in saying that a majority of Christians throughout the history of the Church have believed that only baptized people should participate in Eucharistic meal. I think it's a biblical position both through some direct interpretation of scripture and also through observation of actions we read about there.

As Christians living with a Lutheran understanding we point to two Sacraments: Baptism and the Lord's Table. These are two sacraments given to the church. Our understandings of these as sacraments come this way: Jesus commanded them, they employ earthly elements, a gift is given through them by God. Both are visible means of God's invisible grace to us. So baptism and the Lord's Table are sacraments but they each serve different functions.

Baptism is a one-time event that signifies in part:

- identification with Christ, our spirit is united with His
- initiation into the Christian faith
- **entrance** into the Christian church.

Baptism works forgiveness of sins, delivers from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

There are several passages that point this way – no space to list them all here. However think for example about the Great Commission (we are commanded to make disciples, baptizing them in the name of Father, Son, and Spirit – Matthew 28:19), or multiple references in Acts, where people are baptized in the name of Jesus (Acts 2:39, 8:16; 10:48), or the Epistles, where Paul speaks of being baptized into Christ and into the body (Gal. 3:27; Rom. 6:5). Consider especially 1 Cor. 12:13 where Paul says that by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body. In other words, baptism is what identifies someone with Christ and unites someone to the church. We also see this in Acts 2, where people repent, believe, and are baptized and thus are "added" to the church (Acts 2:38-41).

The Lord's Table, on the other hand, is an ongoing, repeatable event (“as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup do this in remembrance of me”) that signifies in part:

- Fellowship with Christ
- Maintenance in the Christian faith
- **unity** with the Christian church.

This is especially clear in 1 Cor. 10:16-17, where Paul says, “The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread.” You see, Christ doesn't become fragmented in us. Rather, we continue to be unified in Him. We don't reduce Christ to what we are; he raises us to what he is.” This shows us that communion involves both a special fellowship (“participation”) with Jesus and symbolizes our *unity* with the “one body” of Christ (“we who are many are one body”) – that we already belong to.

Baptism Precedes Communion

So, while baptism is an initial, “entrance” or “initiation” into faith and the “Church” on earth, the Lord's Table is an ongoing, continual, and repeated renewal of faith. It would seem disingenuous for someone to participate in a renewal of faith, if they've never professed faith in baptism to start with.

While what we receive in both Baptism and Communion is wholly the work of God for our benefit, I like to think that in the participation of communion, where we walk to the table to receive it – or at least reach our hand up to receive it – or even open our mouths to taste it; we are exercising our faith, acting out our faith that what Jesus says we receive (forgiveness, new life) is really present there. in that which we are about to receive. Communion, from our side of the table at least, is also something of a pledge of renewed trust in Christ and obedience to him (which is one reason why Paul warns against eating or drinking unworthily in 1 Corinthians 1:27). Mostly for the sake of good orderly direction and instruction it would seem to be faulty for someone to take communion when they have not even taken the first step of obedience to Jesus in baptism.



Last but not least there is also the biblical pattern. The sequence is always baptism first, followed by communion. So in Acts 2, for example, it is only those who are baptized and added to the church in verse 41 who then participate in the breaking of bread in verse 42. In 1 Corinthians, when Paul talks at length about communion (in chapter 11), the assumption from earlier in the letter (chapter 1) is that he is writing to baptized Christians. There are no examples in Acts or the Epistles of unbaptized people taking communion.

In closing I need to add a couple of other thoughts. Am I going to hell for giving an unbaptized person communion? I don't think so. Are they going to hell for receiving it? Probably not. God may be divine but believers are not – fully. In some sense we need order and direction to live our lives. The function of baptism before communion is not to prevent, or exclude, but rather to disciple along the way those who desire to know the Risen Lord.

Even though April weather was all over the place we were blessed with good weather the day of the Mackenzie Benefit. What a great event. We had over 300 people in attendance, more than enough volunteers, plenty of baked goods and a large selection of raffle and auctions items. When our small group of people first went into planning this event last October I don't think any of us envisioned how well it would turn out. I want to thank every one who volunteered for the event, made baked goods, donated items or just came out to the event. It was great to see so many people support the Dingeldein family.

Well April has been a busy month for me. I was glad the Benefit went so well and then on a sad note the following Sunday we had Jim Johnson's funeral. Again when I sent the word out for assistance members pitched in and helped where they could. I am thankful for all your help this past month.

Speaking of events and fundraising I want to make you aware of a funding source that we used for the pizza fundraiser we held last December for Mackenzie. It is called Thrivent Action Teams. I applied for and received a \$250 Community Impact card to purchase supplies for this fundraiser. These funds enabled us to offset our costs and provide more funds for the Dingeldein family. It is important to note that the \$250 card can only be used to help purchase materials or to cover expenses to promote or execute a project or activity. The goal is to get a group of people together to work on a project or activity for the benefit of others. The Action Team funds can be easily applied for on the Thrivent website by any Thrivent member. Thrivent provides promotional items and some minimal reporting is required after the event. The funds are available not only for fundraisers but also for educational events and service projects. I know the Quilting ladies have received a couple of cards and the current Haiti's children service project has received a card. This is a great opportunity for our church to do more for others. I can think of several projects we currently hold that we could apply for these funds such as Operation Christmas Child, The Open Table community dinner, the food pantry, Youth group projects and the list goes on. There is going to be a workshop at St. Paul Lutheran in Bonduel on May 27th if you want more information. See the article later in the newsletter for more details about the workshop or see me if you need assistance with making the application.

On my last note, I have not forgotten about my promise to get a group together for spring cleaning. I have been a little bit busy lately but I will be working on this project shortly.

Meeting was called to Order at 8:02 AM, with a brief devotional by President Darrel.
Approval of 3-15-15: Minutes of the Meeting were printed, sent via email, and accepted as printed.

Pastor's Report: In Pastors absence, his report was reviewed and accepted.

Treasurer's Report: In Dennis absence a synopsis was presented from him. Questions were discussed, and upon a Motion by Rohrer, second by Wudtke, and a voice vote, the report was accepted.

Please see that new, or prospective, members receive a copy, there many ways to help the Church. **LP Tank** – Our LP tank is looking a bit shabby and is out of level. John Nelson has offered to re-paint the tank and re-level it. Reminder – these projects are possible because of out-side funds from the operation of the “Red Barn” at Charlie's in Shawano. So when you're asked, please say yes to helping. A few hours from you goes a long way to help make these project possible.

Paint & scrape the entry, garbage bin, & shades & blinds for the windows.
New paraments for the altar.

Fellowship hall flooring – Jean Mueller is looking for others who would like to start the investigation for new flooring for the hall. Please contact Jean or Darrel.





2 cups cheese


2 cups tator tots-still frozen
