
Welcome New Member Janice Waush

Church Chat

from the Church Lady



Well it's that time again, the writing of the Church Chat letter. First on a personal note, I think I am done with all this stormy weather. For those who haven't heard on Monday June 12th we had a storm go through about 7:00pm and we lost electricity. I checked our phone and even the land line was not working. About 20 minutes later my husband came home but I wondered why it took him forever to get in the house. Then I could hear a car horn beeping. I ran outside in the pouring rain and I see his truck is stopped on the road in front of the house. I started to run over to the truck when he opened the window and told me he was caught on a downed power line. Sure enough it was hooked on the front of his truck. I told him the phones weren't working and of course where we live we have no cell phone coverage so I ran to the neighbors. Nope they weren't home either. So I was going to take my car and go down the road to see if I could call from somewhere only I couldn't back out of the driveway since the power line was in front of it. I then drove through my front lawn into the neighbors lawn and out their driveway. I drove down to friends of ours, Donna and Larry Svetnicka and called 911 from their phone. By this time I am a soaking wet. I made it back home before the firetrucks came and saw that our neighbors were now home. I then remembered that our dog who is on the invisible fence needed to be tied up and got that done. I stood on the front porch continuing to get wet until I decided I could see just as well from inside of the house. About 2 hours later WE Energies showed up and my husband was finally able to drive into the driveway and get out of the truck. Of course we had to wait another hour for the electricity to come back on. Apparently a large pine tree had fallen just up the road and snapped the wire. We later found out the power surge had fried our surge protector to the mobile phone so neither the land line nor mobile phone was working until the surge protector was unplugged. Just thankful no one was hurt and no damage to any property. Unfortunately that can not be said for the storm we had the following Wednesday. I understand that there was a lot of trees uprooted and buildings damaged but thankfully no people were hurt. Again, please God I have had enough of this stormy weather!

Some of you may have already heard that we are updating our membership list. During the past year I did some research and discovered that we are missing data such as dates of birth, baptismal and confirmation dates on members who transferred here from other churches throughout the years. Please forward this correspondence on since if we don't hear back follow up phone calls will be made. After the membership is updated we will attempt to get missing information from our current members. This will be a long term project with the hope that we will keep our records current going forward.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

June 18, 2017

Attendance –Dave Rohrer, Glen Peebles, Al Meiers, Dave Klemp, Pastor Marcia Sabin. Guests : Ralph, Darrel Klemp, Bonnie Weyers.

President Dave Rohrer brought meeting to order at 8:00am.

Devotion led by Ralph. Prayer by Pastor. Marcia.

Minutes from May, 2017 meeting were approved. Motion Made-Glen Second-Al Voice Vote

Pastor's Report – Pastors Mark and Marcia will be on vacation Aug 20th, and from Sept 5 through Sept 30. Reserve pastors were discussed and will be contacted about availability and scheduled as needed.

Treasurer's/Finance Report – Lisa was not present, but her report through May 31 was provided and highlighted by Pres. Dave Rohrer. Motion was made to accept report by Glen, second- Dave. Voice vote approved the motion.

Committee Reports – Education – Reminder of VBS July 31-Aug 3rd. Finance – Reviewing CDs, a report will follow soon. Property – Darrel addressed property improvements, 1)Mailbox height was adjusted by Darrel and Everett Olson per the mail carrier's request. 2)Door repair/paint touch up will be continuing by Darrel and John Nelson. 3)Darrel and Everett also attempted to fix the church sign by the road, but realized that some alternative ideas need to be considered due the weathering of the current sign. Some options and estimates will be introduced soon. 4)Mark Engel continues to update lights and ballasts in the church. 5) Darrel also relayed a message from Brad Schuelke that sub-contractors have been chosen for the flooring project, and a suggestion was made to take volunteers from the congregation to do some of the painting. Exact project start date will be coming soon.

Correspondence – Roger Olson from The Gideons wishes to address our congregation, a date in the near future will be chosen for his short presentation. A Thank You letter was received from Pastor Marcia as well.

Old Business – Community Dinners will continue every 3rd Wednesday. June meal will be brats and hotdogs; July will be sub sandwiches with all the fixings. Ralph met with a representative from Lakeshore Cleaners about trimming and cleaning up landscaping around the church. They were very reasonable and will be very helpful in moving forward with this project. A small tractor with a bucket may be needed. If anyone knows of one available contact Darrel or Ralph. No response has been received about the cost to replace the roof yet. Pastors Mark and Marcia Sabin will be officially hired as full time part time at Ascension as of July 1, 2017. Installation service and ceremony is being planned for a later date.

New Business – A motion was made by Glen and second by Al and approved by a voice vote to accept new member request for Nicole Simon and her sons Theodore and Elijah. Welcome them into the Ascension family when you see them. Bonnie is beginning the long process of up dating the church registry. Bonnie, Ruthann Meiers, Pat Zuiches and Dorothy Nelson have drafted a letter which will be sent out asking for information to assist with locating current members and members who may have changed congregations. The council asks for everyone's cooperation with this as it will take a lot of time, but it is necessary for many reasons to know the church membership. Thank you all in advance. Dave Rohrer will be calling around and getting price quotes for propane as this needs to be reviewed and scheduled in advance of winter to get the best price. A review of the current Wedding Policy is going to be done due to legal requirements and Ascension's responsibilities, along with Pastors Mark and Marcia's duties and the church staff. A report will follow.

Date was set for next council meeting to be held July 16, 2017 at 8am. SHARP!

Motion was made by Al and Second by Glen to adjourn meeting at 9:12am.

TOFFEE CRUNCH DESSERT

- 1 1/2 cup cold milk
- 2-8 ounce cartons cool whip
- 1 prepared angel food cake (8-10 ounces) cut or torn into pieces
- Butterfinger candy bars crushed (I usually use about 6 “fun size” bars)
- 1 small box instant vanilla pudding (can use sugar free pudding)

In a large bowl whisk milk and pudding mix about 2 minutes. Let stand about 2 minutes or until soft set. Stir in 1 container of cool whip. Mix well, add remaining container of cool whip. Mix well. Spray a 9x13 pan. Layer half of the cake pieces, half of the pudding mixture and half of the crushed candy bars. Repeat layers. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving. Enjoy!
