If you'd like to sell a box at your place of employment or another business, please see Toni Klemp. All profits will go to the Special Projects Fund.

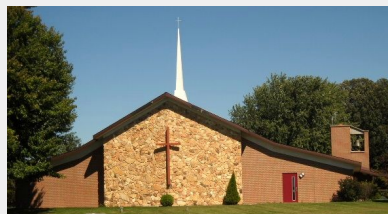
Looking for Thrivent Members

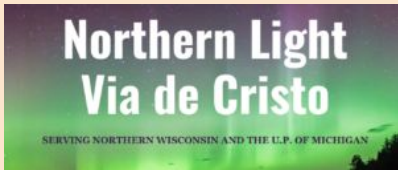

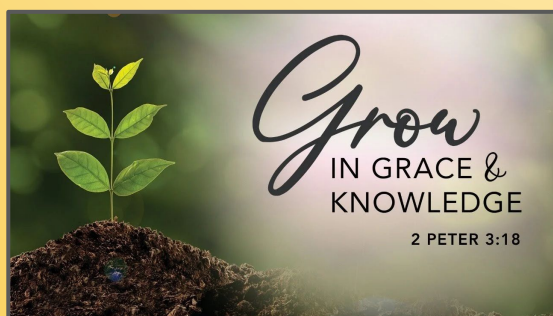

Annual Meeting Minutes

2026 Annual Meeting Ascension Lutheran Church of Navarino Sunday, January 18, 2026

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Brad Schuelke 11:20 following regular worship service and pot luck dinner.

Pastor Mark Sabin delivered the prayer and devotion. There were 31 voting members in attendance.

2025 Annual meeting minutes were published and read by Secretary Cathy Thomas and upon a motion to accept by Darrel Klemp and 2nd by Mike Homan a voice vote the minutes were passed.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Lisa Wollenberg. The budget for 2025-2026 will be \$82,468.00 as expected income and expected expenses to be \$86,820.04. 2025 Expenses exceeded income by \$8,740.35. Motion to accept treasurer's report: 1st by Mike Homan 2nd by Rita Olson, voice vote passed.

The Property committee report for 2025 by Darrel Klemp highlighting on Parking lot reconstruction and repaving done, Solar electric generation system, two gas furnaces just to mention a few.

Nomination and election of council members for 2 years. The floor was opened for nominations Glen Peebles nominated Lisa Wollenberg 2nd by Lois R. Cheryl Wilkinson nominated Mike Homan 2nd by Marlene Westgor. Rita Olson nominated Bonnie Weyers 2nd by Darrel Klemp. Darrel Klemp made a motion to close nominations, 2nd by Glen Peebles. Upon a voice vote it was unanimous that Lisa Wollenberg, Mike Homan and Bonnie Weyers are the new council members.

Benevolence Agencies were discussed and Lisa Wollenberg made a motion to give \$500.00 per month vs. \$100.00 2nd by Darrel Klemp. Voice vote passed.

2026 budget discussed. Motion to reallocate Thrivent, Fish fry fundraiser and Loud offering to General Fund by Mike Homan 2nd by Dave Hoberg. Darrel Klemp made a motion to approve the 2026 budget 2nd by Rita Olson.

Other business: Electronic deposit was discussed for offering in the future. Mike Homan made a motion for electronic deposits to be discussed at the next council meeting 2nd by Darrel Klemp voice vote passed.

Recipe ~ My Thoughts in Words

Cranberry Nut Bread

Submitted by: Diane Engel

2 c. sugar

2 eggs

5 Tablespoons shortening (I use Crisco)

3 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon baking soda

4 c. flour

1 c. orange juice

1 c chopped nuts (I use pecans)

(1/2 lb) 2 c cranberries, cut-up (I slice them in ^{Salad Shooter})
(** see below)

Dissolve salt and baking soda in 2-4 Tbsp. of hot water.

Blend with sugar, eggs and shortening. Add orange juice, flour and baking powder. (start & end with flour)

Stir in nuts and cranberries.

Pour into 2 - 9x5" loaf pans that have been greased and floured (or greased & lined w/parchment)

Bake @ 325° for 1 hour, until toothpick inserted comes out clean.

Remove from pans and cool on wire racks.

* I use 2-3 c cranberries

** I also use 1-2 tsp. grated orange zest (orange part only, no white pith)

My Thoughts in Words By The Church Lady

As I think about Valentine's Day I think about love. I know there are many different kinds of love but the English language doesn't differentiate.

The greek word for spousal love is "eros." This love is chosen and includes physical desire and emotional bonding. It often starts intense and becomes deeper, steadier, and more intentional over time.

Parental love - "storge" - is one-directional at first (you give more than you receive). It's protective and nurturing. It's the kind of love that will lose sleep, skip meals, and walk through fear without hesitation. This type of love also applies to siblings, cousins, and long-term community members.

You may not always *like* them, but there's a deep "we belong to each other" undercurrent.

"Philia" is Friendship Love. This love is built on mutual respect and shared values. It grows slowly and steadily and it thrives on presence, not possession.

A love that is often overlooked is Self-Love. There isn't a greek word for this but it's important nonetheless. This love isn't selfishness—it's recognizing your own dignity. Healthy self-love says: "I matter too, and I will treat myself with care."

And lastly but most importantly, there's "Agape" love. This love is Selfless / Divine Love. It feels like grace, forgiveness, patience, compassion. It's unique because it expects nothing in return. It's love as an *act of will*, not a feeling. In Christian language, this is how God loves. It's what allows people to forgive deeply or love others through hardship.

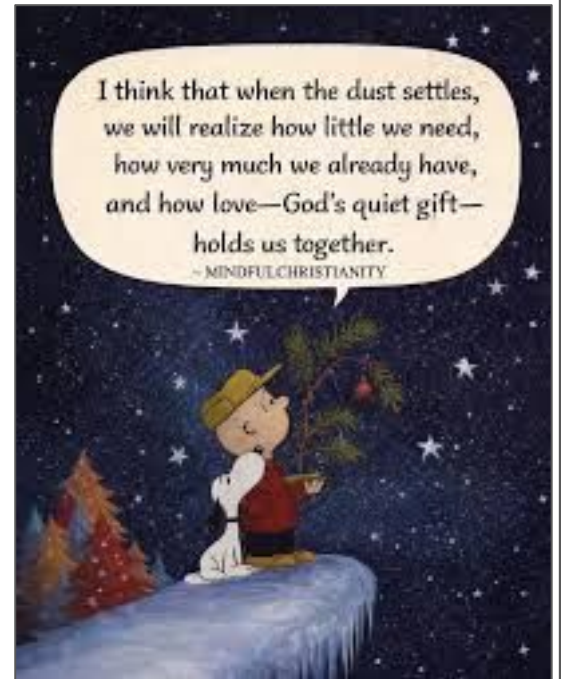
This Valentine's Day I challenge you to think about "Agape" love - a call to love as Christ loves - patient, kind and enduring. "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (1 Corinthians 13:7) That's agape... and it belongs on Valentine's Day just as much as chocolate roses do.

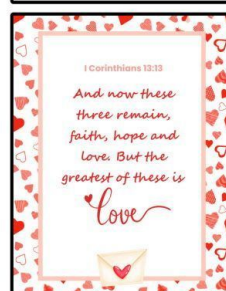
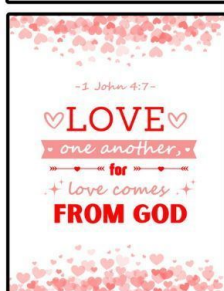
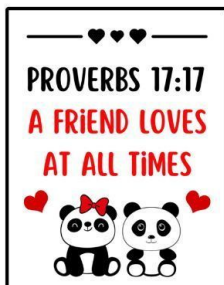
Teach us a big-hearted love, that embraces the pushed aside and powerless, the exploited and those in need. A love that dares to speak truth to power, for their sake.

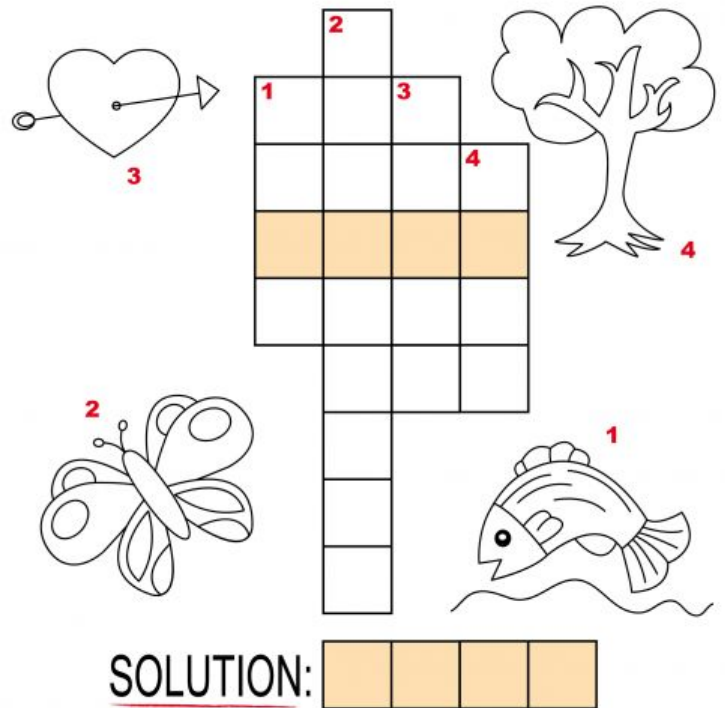

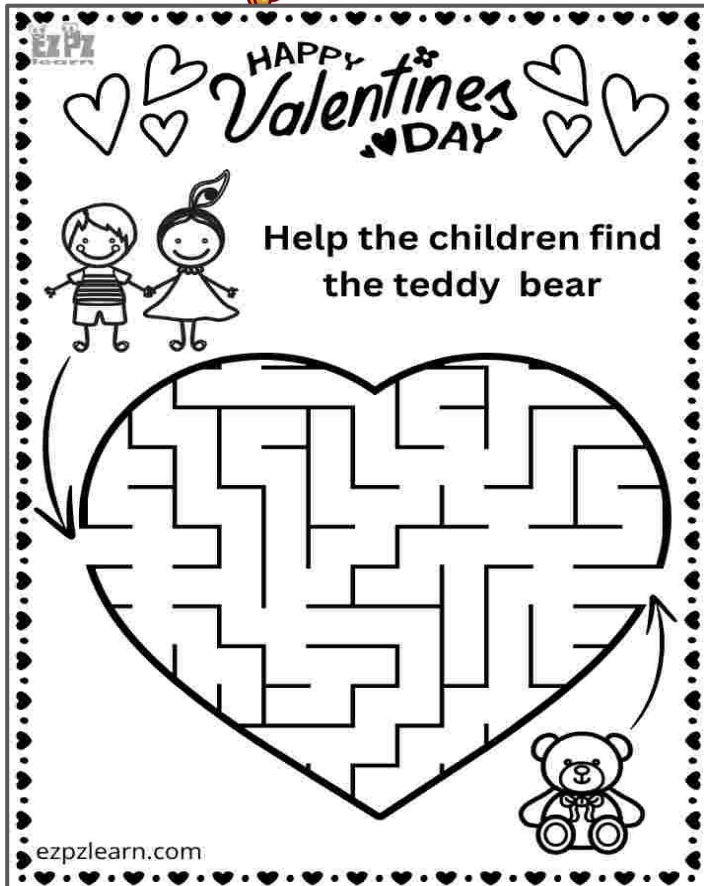
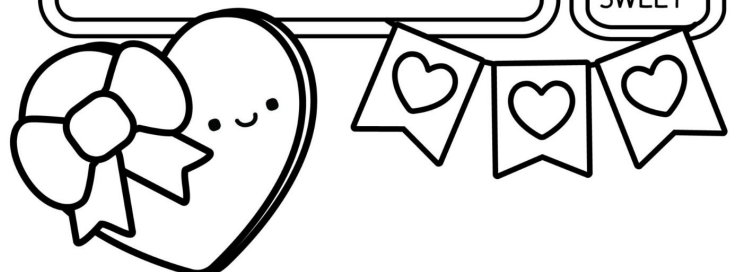
