

Message from the Pastor ~ Bible Studies



Most of the leaves have fallen off the trees. Hope you enjoyed the fall colors. Fall isn't saying goodbye, she is saying "we'll meet again next year." Soon, Winter will announce her arrival. But until then, we celebrate the time of Thanksgiving. It is a time when family and friends come together and eat their fill of Turkey and Ham with all the fixings and of course, the football games. I remember when we went to my family for Thanksgiving. Mother didn't

want anyone in her kitchen. She prepared the whole meal which included her

homemade apple pie. We told mom that we are doing the dishes and for her to sit down with the rest of the family. I think she used every dish in the cupboards.

When Mark received his first Call to Racine, it ended our get-togethers with families. Now it was my turn to make the Thanksgiving meal for my family. I added one tradition to our season. After dinner and the dishes were washed, I would set up the Christmas Village. Back in 1979, I started out with four buildings on a parlor table, with a few figurines, two battery street lights with some snow. Today, the Village covers my whole buffet. I begin to put the Village together with the lights, buildings, many figurines and plenty of trees. It takes at least two hours to put it up. Katie wanted the Village until she saw the work it took to set it up.

Thanksgiving is more than an abundance of food, deer hunting, football and Christmas Villages. The season means what it is named after... Thanksgiving. We are to be mindful of all the blessings of family, friends, food and shelter; thankful for God's grace through Jesus blood on the cross. Only Jesus could reconcile us to God our Father who gives eternal life. Thanksgiving is more than an event. We take one day out of the year to celebrate Thanksgiving, but we are called to be thankful in all things every day. 

Special Congregational Meeting Minutes ~ Parking Lot Update

A Congregational meeting was held Sunday, September 29th to vote on the parking lot and lighting surrounding the church,

Vice President Brad Schuelke led the meeting informing the congregation on the council recommendation for the parking lot. Brad explained that the parking lot has been deteriorating for the past 45 years. Along with pictures Brad showed areas of concern - there is a minimal slope that has created areas of standing water which drains through the cracks in the asphalt. That creates soft spots in the base of the asphalt. He also discussed other concerns, such as concrete replacement in areas that are needed. A vote is needed to hold supplier's prices and materials. Tentative start date would be the summer of 2025.

Brad also discussed the lighting recommendation by the council for the parking lot and entrance areas. Brad opened up Question and Answer time to the congregation. After all the questions were answered the ballots were passed out.

PARKING LOT UPDATE 10/24

With the completion of the 3rd quarter this year, our Special Projects Fund has been growing nicely. We are at about 81% of the total needed to fully cash flow the parking lot repavement. Of course, more than new asphalt will be required. An excavator will place and compact 32 dump truck loads of gravel to replace soft areas at both entrances, and to increase the slope throughout the parking lot for improved surface water drainage. Also, new concrete will be required in some areas to transition to the new grades.

The special congregational meeting also approved exterior lighting upgrades. To improve safety for snow plowing and general parking, the main yard light in the center of the parking lot will be eliminated, and (2) new light poles will be installed along the West edge. These 2 LED lights will be brighter, lessen shadows, and cost less to run. Also, (2) pendant lights will be installed on the East corners of the covered walkway. And finally, we will improve lighting on the South cross and add a light to shine up at our beautiful steeple. Everyone rounding the curve on the highway will see our church!

The lighting phase is starting already, and will be completed in early Nov. The remaining phases will tentatively start on 7/28/25, with completion anticipated for 8/8/25.

We are excited that the congregation voted to approve these projects. We ask for your continued support, as the finish line is in sight.
