A FESTIVAL OF NINE LESSONS AND CAROLS

Leader: The students and pastor at the University of Oxford, England, developed this special celebration. The traditional hymns, song and familiar scripture readings help us hear again the story of God's loving purpose from the first days of our sin until the glorious salvation brought to us through the baby Jesus.

A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols is the Christmas Eve service held in King's College Chapel, University of Cambridge. The Festival was introduced in 1918 to bring a more imaginative approach to worship. It was first broadcast in 1928 and is now broadcast to millions of people around the world. The service includes carols and readings from the Bible.

The opening carol is always 'Once in Royal David's City'. We will begin with that carol today and continue with traditional hymns and some of our own musical selections. Please enjoy.

First Lesson: Genesis 3:8-15, 17-19. God announces in the Garden of Eden Adam and Eve's punishment for their rebellion and that the seed of the woman shall bruise the serpent's head.

Carol: "Once in Royal David's City" Red Hymnal #41 vs 1 & 2

Second Lesson: Genesis 22:15-18. God's promises to Abraham that by his descendants all the nations of the earth shall obtain blessing.

Carol: "Holy Forever" (Christmas Version)

Third Lesson: Isaiah 9:2-7. The prophet announces the birth of a king to a people in darkness.

Carol: "His Name is Wonderful"

Fourth Lesson: Micah 5:2-5a. The king is coming and will usher in a reign of justice for the poor and peace for all of God's creation.

Carol: "O Little Town of Bethlehem" Hymn #41 vs 1&4

Fifth Lesson: Luke 1:26-35, 38. The angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will give birth to God's promised Son whose kingdom shall never end.

Carol: "Make Room"



Sixth Lesson: Luke 2:1-7. Against a backdrop of emperors and taxes, Jesus is born.

Carol: "What Child is This?" with "This Is Our God"

Seventh Lesson: Luke 2:8-16. The shepherds go to see the Savior of the world, lying in a manger.

Carol: "Away in a Manger Medley" Hymn #67

Eighth Lesson: Matthew 2:1-11. The wise men follow a star to find the child Jesus, the King of the Jews.

Carol: "We Three Kings" verses 1 & 2

Ninth Lesson: John 1:1-14. John unfolds the great mystery of Emmanuel, God with us, becoming like

us, to live among us.

Carol: "Light of the World"
