Message from the Pastor



Do you know who you are? Seriously, who are you? Are you a farmer, are you a teller in a bank, do you work at a foundry, a teacher, garbage collector or a pastor? These are jobs or callings and the list goes on. Do we like what we do because we need to pay bills and put food on the table? Yes, of course.

But what makes you who you are? Okay, too many questions. According to Martin Luther, all forms of work are a calling from God. No matter what our station is in life, we are needed. If we really dislike our job we may want to consider looking

somewhere else. My brother retired 10 years early. He literally hated his job (his words, not mine). It was affecting him and he was not the brother I use to know. Money was not the issue; it was for his physical health.

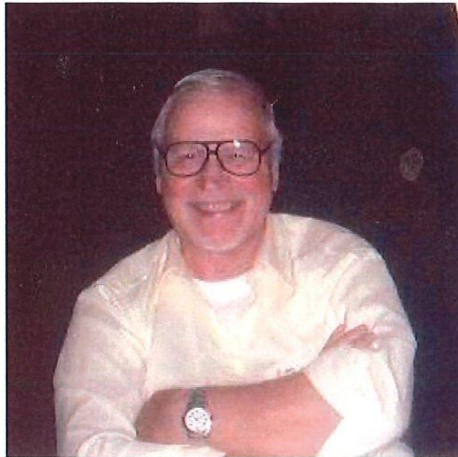

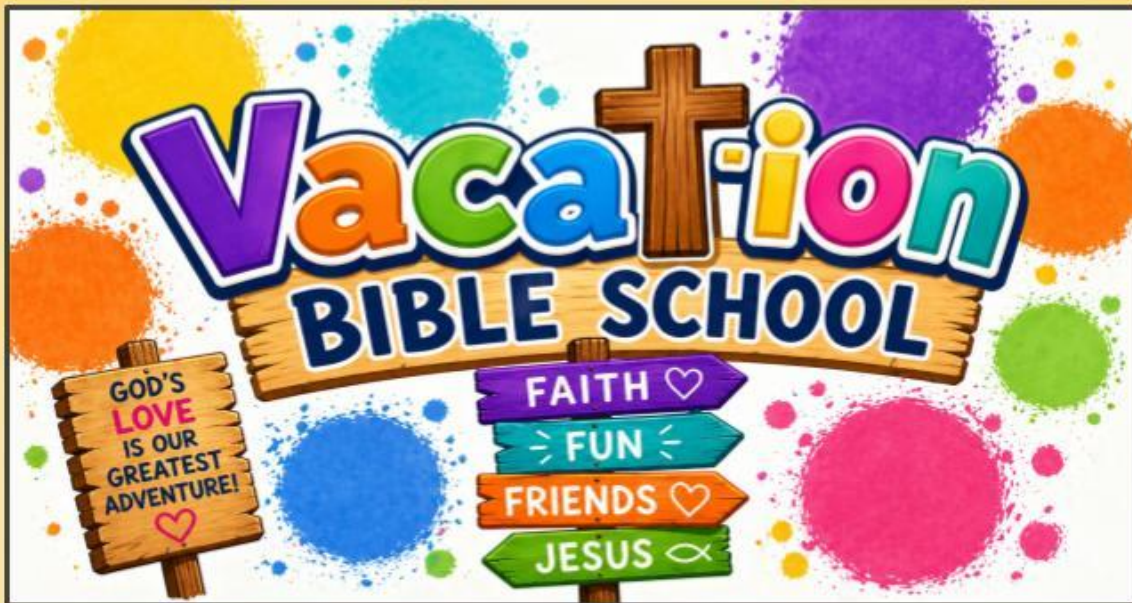

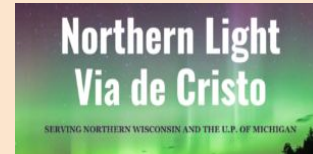

Ascension Lutheran Church Of Navarino Council Meeting Minutes Wednesday, June 17, 2026

Present: Carmen Wetzel, Brad Schuelke, Mike Homan, Lisa Wollenberg

The meeting was called to order at 6:02 by President Carmen Wetzel.

Devotion John 15:1-9 read by Carmen and Prayer read by Mike

Last Month's meeting minutes approved. Motion to accept made by Mike, and 2nd by Brad. Voice vote passed.

Pastors Report: 8 member visits including home visits and nursing home visits with Holy Communion. Grief Counseling sessions for the Al Meiers family.

Treasurer's report: May 2026; Income Received \$10,140.00, YTD: \$49,939.83. Income exceeding expenses \$17,284.29 through May 31st.

Project Fund Income \$9,271.00 received from Brat Fry, Eggs, Script Cards sold, Fellowship, and a Misc. Donation.

Project Fund Expense: \$292.50 for additional Scrip cards purchased.

Motion to approve Treasurer's report by Brad and 2nd by Mike. Voice vote passed.

Old Business:

- 1) Support for flood victims. Giving is going well. Flood victims must apply to receive funds.
- 2) Insurance review – Spoke with Brotherhood Insurance via phone, their policy is a little different than the current policy. Motion made by Mike and 2nd by Brad to request an updated quote from Rural Mutual based on actual replacement value to compare policies apples to apples. Council will review both quotes and make a decision by July 1st.
- 3) Scholarship applications – revisit bylaws to clarify requirements-
 - a) Payout period to be 12 months.
 - b) Maximum Payout \$250.00 per application. Tabled
- 4) Maintenance items:
 - a) Motion made by Lisa and 2nd by Mike to move forward with ordering 2 handrails to be installed on the step leading up to the communion rail.
 - b) Motion made by Mike and 2nd by Carmen to purchase a 10' conference table to not exceed \$500 for the library to accommodate larger groups more comfortably.
 - c) Motion made by Mike and 2nd by Carmen to accept the quote for the installation of a 3-wire 50 Amp receptacle behind the oven to accommodate a 3rd deep fryer. The cost of this installation will come from the proceeds from the fish fry.
 - d) Gravel for truck access to propane tank and septic system. – Tabled
 - e) Replacement of the septic system holding tanks in the future, as they are made of steel rather than concrete and are nearing the end of their service life. New tanks would be concrete. \$13,000 to \$15,000 for 2- 2000 gal tanks. - tabled

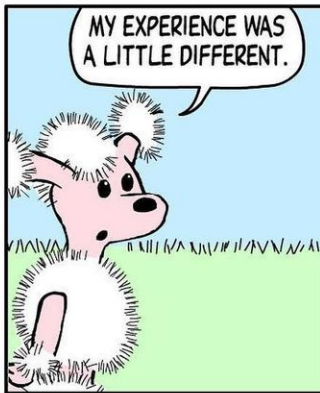
