Message from the Pastor ~ Learning Opportunities



Ecclesiastes 3:1 “For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.” Here we are in November already. The harvest has begun in late October and into November. The farmer knows when to sow his crops in spring and harvest in the fall. How fortunate we are to have dedicated farmers to work the land and raise farm animals so we have an abundance of food.

Thanksgiving Day is a unique holiday to America. Our kids are taught that the first pilgrims to land on the shore (that we call the United States) and the Indigenous people came together at some point. These people have been called Indians; but the term should be identified to those who are from India. The Indigenous people existed in America long before the Colonists arrived. In winter, the trees are having their beauty sleep, and life will be renewed in spring. The cycle of renewal begins again. God created his world in an orderly way.

Remember, we are to be thankful every day; not just on Thanksgiving Day. Enjoy November and the snow it will bring.

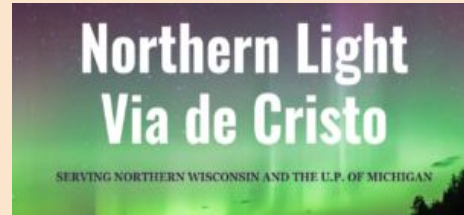

1,800 Yanks Feared Lost In Jap Prison Ship Sinking

Navarino Sergeant, One of Five Survivors, Tells Story

The sinking of a Japanese ship carrying 1,800 allied prisoners, mostly Americans, was revealed today in the story of Sergeant Avery Wilber, 32, son of Edward Wilber, Navarino, one of the five known survivors.

Sergeant Wilber, who is visiting now at the home of his fiancée, Miss Marjorie Wilkinson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Tom Wilkinson, 308 E. Franklin street, was on Corregidor when it fell to the Japs almost three years ago, and when the Americans returned to the islands last fall he and the 1,800 others, including a handful of British and Dutch prisoners, were crowded into the prison ship and headed for Japan.

Containing prisoners from a number of different Philippine camps, the ship sailed Oct. 11. At 5 o'clock the afternoon of Oct. 24 a torpedo roared into it, breaking it in two. Shrapnel hit a few of the prisoners in the hold, including Sergeant Wilber, but the direct hit was on the other side of the bulkhead, and most of the Americans were able to run for the deck.

"We were able to walk right off the ship into the water because the back end of the deck was under water," Wilber said. "I floated around in the water for three or four hours and then a life boat that got away from the Japs came drifting by."

Already in the boat was Robert S. Overbeck, Baltimore, Md., who had been a civil engineer on Corregidor and who is now a lieutenant in the army. Wilber climbed in, and shortly thereafter they picked up Corporal Antone Cichy, New York Mills, Minn. It wasn't until the next morning that they found the other two, Corporal Don E. Meyer, Wilmington, Calif., and Master Sergeant Calvin Graef, Silver City, N. M., who had spent the night floating on a raft.

The Japanese had used all the other life boats to transport themselves to one of their destroyers

standing nearby. The Jap destroyer didn't shell the Yanks in the water, but neither did it help them, Wilber said.

During the night the life boat carrying the three Americans bumped into a box. It was hauled aboard, and the large piece of canvas in it was used as a blanket. The night was cold, and a strong wind was blowing. When morning came, the men discovered to their delight that the canvas was a sail that fit their boat.

So, with only the stars, sun and moon to guide them, and three gallons of water and a can of cookies that they found in the boat to sustain them, they sailed for China. Aided by a strong wind, they made the 250-mile trip in three days, landing on the China coast Oct. 27. En route they encountered no enemy opposition. Some Japanese bombers flew over but didn't bother them. Because they thought the trip would take longer, they had carefully rationed out their water and cookies and still had some left when they reached China.

Gets Purple Heart

Who helped them in China they can't say, but they were soon with the Flying Tigers of the 14th Air Force and were transported to the United States by plane.

In Washington, D. C., there was a conference with General Marshall, who pinned the Purple Heart on Sergeant Wilber's blouse. The medal carries a cluster with it for

the sergeant was wounded twice, on Corregidor and on the prison ship.

Where the torpedo came from that sank the prison ship Sergeant Wilber doesn't know.

He has gained 40 pounds since his escape from the Japs, but the soldier said he had received no rough treatment from the enemy. "But they did starve us like the devil," he remarked.

Sergeant Wilber was in several different camps in the Philippines, including that at Cabanatuan, from which the remaining Americans were freed in the daring Ranger attack of last month. More recently he was in a Manila camp, and saw the American planes come over.

"It was like a bee-hive kicked over," was the way he described the large Yank air fleet that bombed the city Sept. 21.

All the prisoners knew that they were being transferred to Japan because the Americans were coming back to the Philippines.

Sergeant Wilber entered the service Feb. 5, 1941, and sailed from San Francisco for the Philippines June 6, 1941. Before entering the army he worked in a garage at Navarino.

Arriving in the United States early in December, he got home before Christmas. Before he reports March 15 in Florida, he and Miss Wilkinson will be married. They have set March 3 as the date.

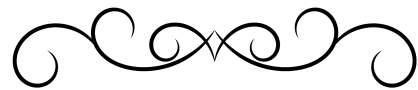

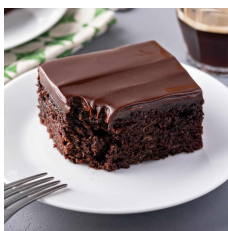


This & That

Chocolate Zucchini Cake *Submitted by Sarah Olson*

Cake:

2 C Sugar
4 Eggs
1 1/2 C Vegetable Oil or Applesauce
2 C Flour
3/4 C Cocoa Powder
2 tsp Baking Soda
1 tsp Baking Powder
1/2 tsp Cinnamon
1/2 tsp Salt
3 C Shredded Zucchini



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9x13 cake pan or Bundt pan. In a large mixing bowl, beat sugar, eggs and oil or applesauce until smooth. In a small mixing bowl, combine the flour, cocoa powder, baking soda, baking powder, cinnamon and salt. Gradually beat in the flour mixture to the sugar mixture. Fold in zucchini. Pour into prepared pan. Bake 50-60 minutes, or until an inserted toothpick comes out clean. Cool completely before frosting.

Frosting:

6 Tbsp Cocoa Powder
1/4 C Butter, melted
2 C Powdered Sugar
1/4 C Milk
1/2 tsp Vanilla

Melt the butter. Combine with cocoa powder and set aside to cool. In a medium mixing bowl, blend together the powdered sugar, milk and vanilla. Stir into the cocoa mixture. Spread over cooled cake.



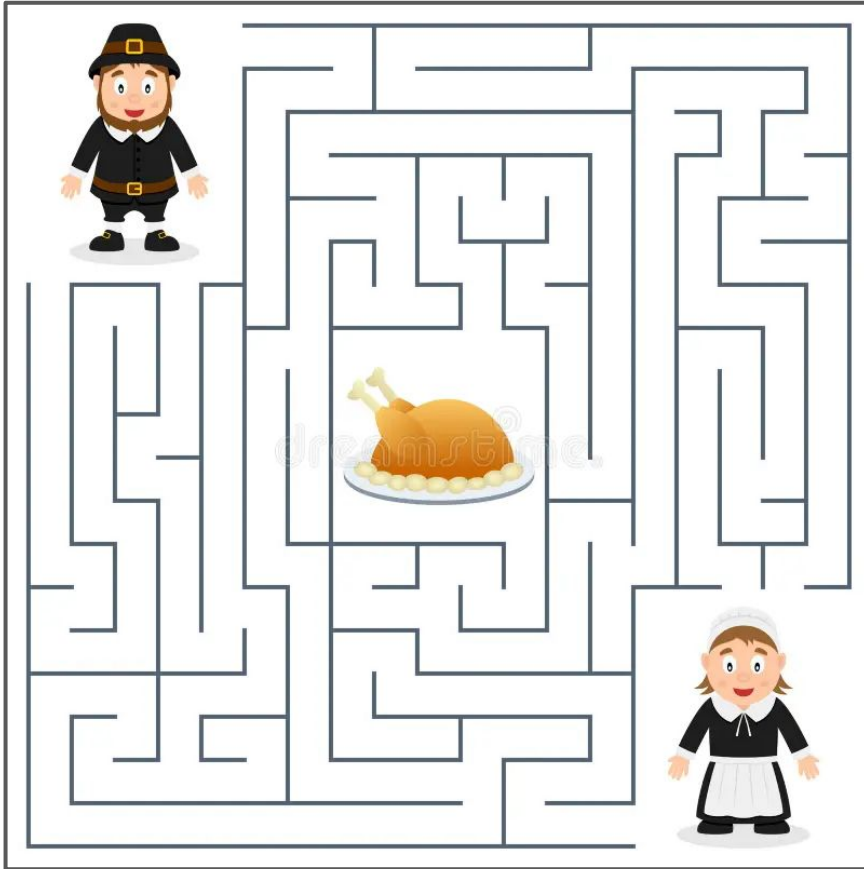
