Ascension Lutheran Church Of Navarino Council Meeting Minutes Wednesday, July 15, 2026

Present: Carmen Wetzel, Bonnie Weyers, Lisa Wollenberg

Absent: Jake Hartlaben, Mike Homan, Brad Schuelke

Guest: Glen Peebles

The meeting was called to order at 6:16 by President Carmen Wetzel.

No Devotion or Prayer provided

Last Month's meeting minutes were reviewed but not approved without a quorum.

Pastors Report: Not presented, pastors on vacation.

Treasurer's report: June 2026; Income Received \$7,016.00, YTD: \$56,955.83. Income exceeding expenses \$17,815.06 through June 30th.

Project Fund Income \$2,925.00 received from Script Cards sold, Eggs and a Misc. Donation.

Project Fund Expense: \$4,992.50 for additional Scrip cards was purchased.

Old Business:

- 1) Support for flood victims. Giving is going well. Flood victims must apply to receive funds. Confirmed the funds received will be given out the first week in August.
- 2) Scholarship applications – revisit bylaws to clarify requirements-
 - a) Payout period to be 12 months.
 - b) Maximum Payout \$250.00 per application. Tabled
- 3) It's been recommended by the Bishop to have a delegate and a guest attend the Annual District NALC Annual Meeting, October 2nd and 3rd in Denmark. Please contact a council member if interested in attending.
- 4) Maintenance items:
 - a) Motion made by Lisa and 2nd by Mike to move forward with ordering 2 handrails to be installed on the step leading up to the communion rail. - **No Update**
 - b) Motion made by Mike and 2nd by Carmen to purchase a 10' conference table to not exceed \$500 for the library to accommodate larger groups more comfortably. - **No Update**
 - c) Motion made by Mike and 2nd by Carmen to accept the quote for the installation of a 3-wire 50 Amp receptacle behind the oven to accommodate a 3rd deep fryer. The cost of this installation will come from the proceeds from the fish fry. - **No Update on installation date**
 - d) Gravel for truck access to propane tank and septic system. – **Tabled**
 - e) Replacement of the septic system holding tanks in the future, as they are made of steel rather than concrete and are nearing the end of their service life. New tanks would be concrete. \$13,000 to \$15,000 for 2- 2000 gal tanks. – **Tabled**

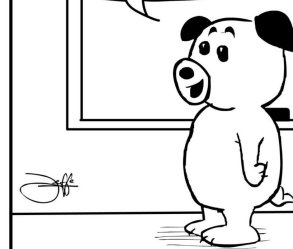

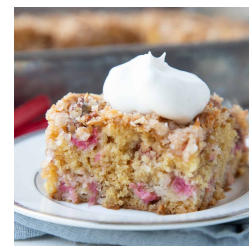

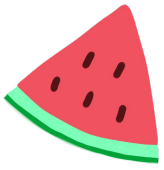
